



Impact of the Pupil Premium Grant 2013-15

The tables below show the impact the strategies have had on the overall aim of closing the gap in attainment and progress at Key Stage 4. The data is shown as the percentage of students achieving 5 or more GCSE's at A*-C (including English & Maths) as well as the percentage of students making expected progress in English and Maths at the end of Year 11. The graphs show pupil premium vs. non pupil premium at school and national level.

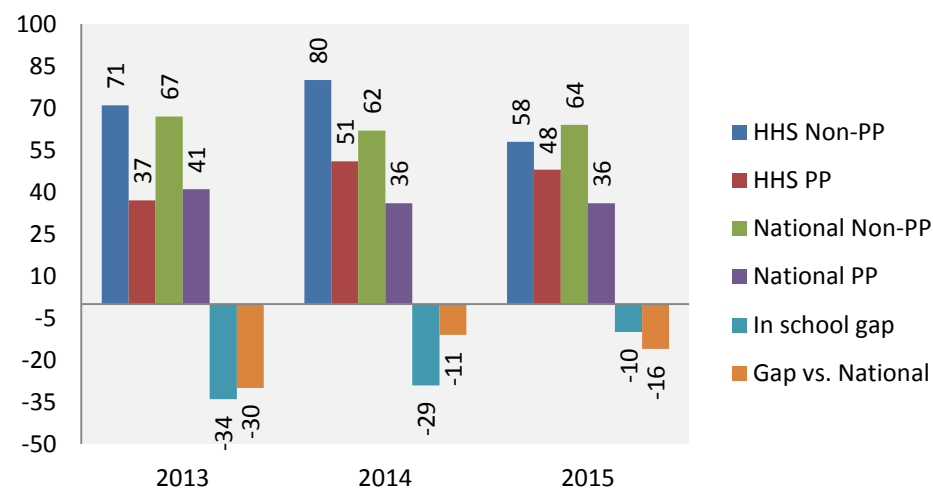
The gap refers to the difference between pupil premium students and non pupil premium students at Hellesdon High School (in school gap) and the difference between pupil premium students at Hellesdon High School and non pupil premium students nationally (gap vs. national).

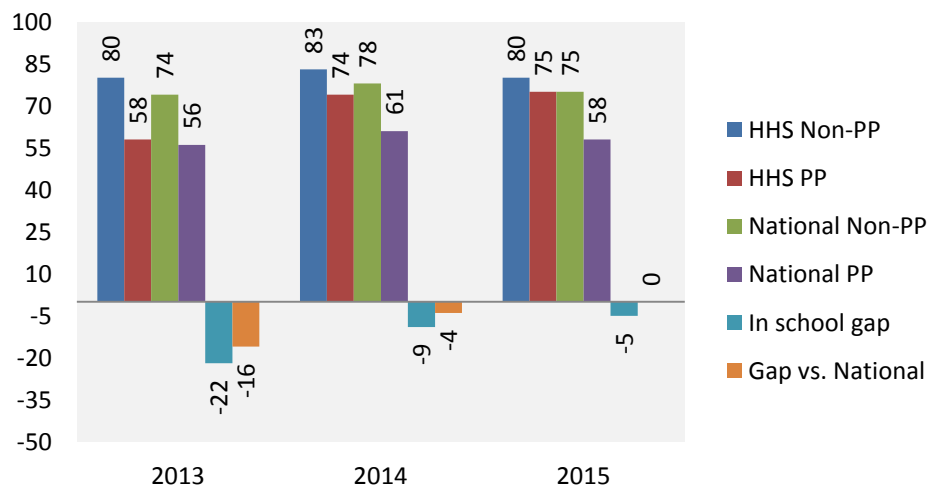
